RESOLUTION # 24-8-4

A RESOLUTION AMENDING CHARGES AND RENTS FOR THE USE OF THE MUNICIPALLY OWNED SYSTEM OF SEWERAGE OF THE VILLAGE OF WAYNESFIELD, AUGLAIZE COUNTY, OHIO

WHEREAS, the council of the Village of Waynesfield, Auglaize County, Ohio deems it necessary to establish new rates for the Village sanitary sewerage system in order to accommodate rising costs associated with the system and to provide accommodation for Village Customers regarding the use of said system.

WHEREAS, the Village of Waynesfield Council wishes to repeal and replace Resolution No. 22-11-2.

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED BY THE COUNCIL OF THE VILLAGE OF WAYNESFIELD, OHIO AS FOLLOWS:

SECTION I. SEWER RATES

Rates for the use of the system of sewerage of the Village of Waynesfield shall be metered as follows:

a. Residential Rate within corporation limits

Base Rate: Residential Rate Within Corporation Limits

Base Rate \$29.50/month first 2,000 gallons included in base rate. After the first 2,000 gallons \$2.78 per 1,000 gallons used.

b. Residential Rate outside of corporation limits

Base Rate \$34.50/month first 2,000 gallons included in base rate. After the first 2,000 gallons \$2.78 per 1,000 gallons used.

c. Commercial Rate within corporation limits

Base Rate \$29.50/month first 2,000 gallons included in base rate. After the first 2,000 gallons \$2.78 per 1,000 gallons used.

d. Commercial Rate outside of corporation limits

Base Rate \$34.50/month first 2,000 gallons included in base rate. After the first 2,000 gallons \$2.78 per 1,000 gallons used.

SECTION II. SEWER RATE EXCEPTIONS

Sewer rates shall not be charged in the following circumstances:

1. Non-Commercial Recreational Swimming Pools

- a. Customers who fill non-commercial recreational swimming pools intended for private use utilizing the municipal water system shall not be charged a sewer fee if all of the following apply:
 - i. Customer must contact the Village of Waynesfield before filling the pool;
 - Customer must provide to the Village of Waynesfield with written evidence from the manufacturer/installer regarding the dimensions and volume of the pool to be filled utilizing the municipal water system;
 - iii. The Village Administrator shall verify the filling of the pool after complete; and
 - iv. The Customer does not discharge the pool into the Village sewer system upon draining.
- b. If the conditions of Section II(1)(a)(i)-(ii) are met, then the Village shall calculate the gallons to be utilized to fill the pool based upon the manufacturer's specifications and the Village utility department shall be authorized to reduce the Customer's sewerage bill by the applicable sewerage rate set forth in Section I multiplied by the gallons of water determined to be utilized to fill the pool.
- c. Determinations of the applicability of this Section shall be in the discretion of the Village Administrator whose determination shall be final.

2. Leaks

- a. Customers who experience a leak and can demonstrate to the Village within a reasonable degree of certainty that the leaked water did not enter into the Village's sewer system shall not be charged a sewer fee for the water lost due to the leak if all of the following apply:
 - i. The Customer notifies the Village of the leak;
 - ii. The Customer provides to the Village either attestation from a licensed plumber regarding presence of the leak or the Village Administrator or a member of the Village sewer department verifies the leak;
 - iii. The Customer has not been granted relief under this Section within the last twelve (12) months of the requested time period for the reported leak;
 - iv. The Customer provides to the Village evidence sufficient in the discretion of the Village Administrator to establish that the leaked water did not enter into the sewer system;
 - v. The Customer provides to the Village the approximate date of the leak and the estimated gallons;
 - vi. The Village Administrator or a member of Village sewer department is able to within a reasonable degree of certainty reconcile the increased usage of the Customer with the dates of the leak and the estimated gallons lost; and
 - vii. The Village Administrator determines that:
 - 1. The increased usage during the applicable time period reasonably reflects the estimated gallons leaked; and
 - 2. The leaked gallons did not enter into the Village sewer system.
- b. If the conditions of Section II(2)(i-vi) are met, then the Village shall reduce the Customer's sewer bill by the applicable sewerage rate set forth in Section I

multiplied by the gallons determined to be leaked that did not enter into the Village sewer system.

c. Determinations of the applicability of this Section shall be in the discretion of the Village Administrator whose determination shall be final.

3. Irrigation

- a. Customers who wish to utilize the Village water system for irrigation shall not be charged a sewer fee for water utilized for irrigation purposes if all of the following apply:
 - i. The Customer notifies the Village <u>before</u> utilizing village water for irrigation purposes;
 - ii. The Customer purchases and installs a village approved water meter prior to utilizing village water for irrigation purposes; and
 - iii. The Village sewer department inspects and approves the village approved water meter prior to the Customer utilizing Village water for irrigation purposes.
- b. If the conditions of Section II(3)(i-iii) are met, then the Village shall reduce the Customer's sewer bill by the applicable sewerage rate set forth in Section I multiplied by the gallons reflected by the Village approved water meter utilized for irrigation purposes.
- c. Determinations of the applicability of this Section shall be in the discretion of the Village Administrator whose determination shall be final.

SECTION III - ANNUAL INCREASE

There is to be an automatic 3% annual increase on the rate assessed to each 1,000 gallons after the initial 2,000 gallons (currently \$2.78) across all rate schedules to adjust for increased operating expenses to be effective January 1, of each year, beginning in January of 2025. For the avoidance of doubt, the 3% annual increase shall not apply to the Base Rate as set forth in the rate schedules in Section I.

NOW THEREFORE BE IT RESOLVED this Resolution shall supersede all ordinances and resolutions inconsistent with the provisions hereof.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED the Council finds and determines that all formal actions of this Council relating to the adoption of this Resolution have been taken at open meetings of this Council and that deliberations of this Council and its committees resulting in such formal actions, took place in open meetings open to the public, in compliance with all statutory requirements including the requirements of Section 121.22 of the Ohio Revised Code.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED This Resolution is declared to be an emergency measure necessary for the immediate preservation of the public peace, health, safety, and welfare of the Village of Waynesfield and will take immediate effect.

BE IT FURTHER RESOLVED that this Resolution shall be in full force and effect and take effect from and after the earliest period allowed by law.

ORDINANCE 2024-8-1

AN ORDINANCE TO AMEND ORDINANCE 23-10-6 TO AMEND THE ANNUAL APPROPRIATIONS ORDINANCE AND TO DECLARE AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, the Council of the Village of Waynesfield, Ohio has reviewed the Annual Appropriations Ordinance and has determined it is necessary to amend certain fund account totals to reflect the actual amounts to be appropriated.

NOW, THEREFORE, BE IT ORDAINED by the Council of the Village of Waynesfield, Ohio:

<u>Section1</u>: The Annual Appropriations Ordinance Number 2023-10-6 in the amount of \$3,225,212.68, which provides appropriations for the fiscal year ending December 31, 2024, will be amended to reflect the following changes in order to meet current expenses and to authorize certain other exenditures:

The Fiscal Officer is hereby authorized to make payments from any of the appropriations herein made, upon receiving proper claims, certificates and / or vouchers approved by the officials, department heads, or their respective designees, authorized by law to approve the same, or upon an ordinance or resolution of Council to make expenditures; provided, however, that no payments for salaries or wages shall be made except to persons employed in accordance with the ordinances of the Village of Waynsefield and / or laws of the State of Ohio.

SECTION 4. The Fiscal Officer is hereby authorized to adjust appropriations within any fund or department, so long as the adjustments made do not exceed the total appropriations authorized within any fund or department. In addition, the Fiscal Officer is hereby authorized to establish additional accounts within any fund as may from time to time be required to ensure proper accounting or by the State of Ohio.

SECTION 5. That it is found and determined that all formal actions of this Council concerning and relating to the adoption of this Ordinance were adopted in an open meeting of the Council, and that all deliberations of this Council and of any of its committees that resulted in such formal action were in meetings open to the public and in compliance with all legal requirements.

Section 3: This ordinance is declared to be an emergency and therefore take effect and be in full force immediately upon its passage and approval.

WHEREAS, Police Canine Hunter has served the Village of Waynesfield since September 29, 2016, and as a K9 partner he has apprehended violent criminals, has detected illegal and dangerous narcotics, connected the police department with the community in ways only a police canine can do, and has located vital evidence in the course of his duties, and

WHEREAS, after nearly 8 years of dedicated service, Police Canine Hunter has experienced a decline in health namely he has experienced diminished night vision due to cataracts and the beginning stages of hip dysplasia, and

WHEREAS, pursuant to Ohio Revised Code Section 9.62, if a police dog is no longer fit for duty, the law enforcement officer to whom the dog is assigned may purchase the animal for one dollar (\$1.00).

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the Village of Waynesfield, County of Auglaize, State of Ohio, as follows:

- 1. Police Canine Hunter's retirement is hereby approved effective September 1, 2024.
- 2. Police Canine Hunter may be purchased by Chief Nathan Motter for the amount of \$1.00 pursuant to Ohio Revised Code Section 9.62.
- 3. This Resolution shall be in full force and effect from the earliest period allowed by law

RESOLUTION 24-8-5 A RESOLUTION AUTHORIZING THE VILLAGE OF WAYNESFIELD TO APPLY FOR A .GOV DOMAIN MIGRATION GRANT AND TO DECLARE AN EMERGENCY

WHEREAS, the Village of Waynesfield would like to migrate its current website and email domains into a more secure and trustworthy .gov domain, and

WHEREAS, unlike other domains, .gov is only available to official U.S.-based government organizations and publicly controlled entities, and

WHEREAS, users visiting a .gov website or receiving an email from a .gov email address can be more confident that the content is genuine government information, and

WHEREAS, the .gov domain can help the public better recognize official government sites and emails while avoiding phishing attempts and websites that impersonate government offices, and

THEREFORE, BE IT RESOLVED by the Council of the Village of Waynesfield, County of Auglaize, State of Ohio, as follows:

- 1. The Village of Waynesfield may apply for the .gov domain migration grant through CyberOhio with a grant award of up to \$9,500 with the village paying a maximum 20% match and CyberOhio providing 80% of the funding needed to complete the migration.
- 2. This Resolution shall be in full force and effect from the earliest period allowed by law.
